OUR APPROACH

The SOC teams work closely with families with children from birth to 21 years, assisting in problemsolving and establishing or rebuilding relationships between families, community organizations, and schools.

Coming Soon! Dialectical Behavior Therapy

DBT is an evidence-based therapy used to help youth who struggle with negative feelings, behaviors and appropriate friendships.

Parents and teachers sometimes say that they have to "walk on eggshells" in order to avoid explosions of feelings and behaviors from struggling youth. DBT addresses these issues through structured treatment to improve upon the youth's abilities to increase flexible thinking and gain more control over negative feelings and behaviors.

TEEN INTERVENE

Designed for youth, 12-19, who are experiencing mild to moderate problems associated with alcohol or other drug use, the Teen Intervene Program provides education, support, and guidance for teens and their families. Youth work with a prevention specialist in identifying and changing their choices and behaviors.

Teen Intervene Program helps youth identify the reasons they have chosen to use alcohol or other drugs, examine the effects of substance abuse in their lives, and learn to make healthier choices. Teen Intervene consists of 3-6 sessions with a prevention specialist.
