TO: Board of Education RE: Reopening Plan Update

DATE: October 6, 2020

On Tuesday, letters were sent home to families of students in grades PreK-5 regarding the reopening of school on October 13, 2020. The documents were meant to provide parents with updated changes to protocols, a flowchart to determine if their child should come to school, and examples of what the day would look like based on the child's grade level. The letter and documents are attached.


REOPENING PLAN UPDATES

Since the plan was written in July, we have continued to update our protocols and documentation. Here are the changes that have been made to the plan:

- FACE COVERINGS: Prior to the return of staff in September, we instituted a mandatory face covering protocol. The only exception while inside the building is when someone is alone in an office/classroom or when someone is seated for a meal. This change in protocol was based on the growing evidence that COVID19 is transmitted primarily through the air.
- **DISALLOWED FACE COVERINGS:** Again, based on the most current information and guidance from our local Department of Health, we are no longer allowing gaiters, bandannas, or face coverings with exhalation vents.
- FACE COVERING BREAKS: All face covering breaks will occur outside.
- STAFF ATTESTATION: Our plan originally was to have staff complete paper documentation of their attestation to the COVID19 questions; however, we quickly learned that process was too cumbersome. We are now using the Public School Works Health Assistant program to have staff complete an electronic attestation prior to coming to work.
- **CROP:** Although we do not plan to do in-person CROP until after January 1, 2021, we are working to develop virtual activities for students.
- ATHLETICS: All fall sports are postponed until at least March 1, 2021. Decisions regarding basketball practices and conditioning activities will be decided by the Tri-Valley League by late-October or early-November.

Dear Parent/Guardian:

I hope that this letter finds you and your family doing well. As we prepare to reopen school for in-person instruction for students in grades PK-5, I am writing to provide you with the updated guidelines that will be in place when your child returns along with documents that summarize the information in our reopening plan.

- **Face Coverings:** Face coverings are required at all times on the buses and inside the building. The only exception is when students are seated for meals.
- **Disallowed Face Coverings:** Bandannas, gaiters, and face coverings with vents are not allowed.
- Face Covering Breaks: Teachers will schedule face covering breaks no less than once every hour. Breaks will occur OUTSIDE. Please make sure your child wears appropriate clothing to be outside.
- **Hand Sanitizing:** Hand sanitizers are available in every classroom and in the cafeteria. Children will be encouraged to use the hand sanitizer throughout the day under the supervision of staff.
- Water Fountains: We have replaced all of our water fountains to the type that accept water bottles. We encourage students to bring their own water bottles with their name on them.

We are providing these documents to assist each family in knowing when to keep their child(ren) at home and to provide an overview of what the day will look like for students. SHOULD I SEND MY CHILD TO SCHOOL?

Have they tested **POSITIVE** for COVID19?

Have they had direct contact with someone who has tested positive?

Do they have COVID19 symptoms? Fever over 100F, persistent cough, sore throat, diarrhea, loss of taste/smell, or shortness of breath

Stay at home for 14 days from the first date of symptoms OR 14 days from your test date if you have no symptoms.

A new negative test is **NOT** required.



YES Call school nurse ASAP 286-7911



Stay at home for 14 days after the last exposure to the positive person **AND** monitor for symptoms taking temperature twice a day for a minimum of 14 days. If higher than 100.0F, or your child starts developing symptoms, contact your healthcare provider immediately.

Student must wait to return to school for 14 days from the last exposure.

A COVID19 test is **NOT** required.

Stay at home, monitor your temperature, AND contact your healthcare provider for evaluation and testing.

In order to return to school prior to 14 days, a negative COVID19 test is **REQUIRED.**
